We are coming down to the wire to submit our initial Lead Pipe Service Line Inventory (LSLI) to KDHE. It is due to KDHE October 16th, 2024. We sent out the surveys in February of 2023, followed up with another letter August 10th, 2023, to those that did not respond to the first letter and then again with e-mails starting in October 2023 to those that we found had them.

The City of Marysville is required by the EPA & KDHE as a Public Water Service (PWS) system to prepare, maintain and ***this inventory to be submitted annually***. After the completion of the initial inventory has been submitted, we then have 30 days to notify customers where a known or a potential service line containing lead is present. If you answered lead, galvanized needing replacement, or unknown on your initial survey follow-up letters will be sent until you return a survey showing that any lead or galvanized needing replacement is no longer in your home or business. Answers of unknown must be replaced with actual material to be acceptable. Until these are received you will continue to get an annual letter concerning your water pipes. The goal of KDHE and the EPA is to make sure that lead and galvanized water pipes needing replacement are replaced to make your drinking water safer.

New customers' water system shall also be required to provide the notice at the time of service initiation. We will have a link for the information and a survey for those of you who would like to print & fill one out on our website www.cityofmarysvilleks.com. If you are unsure as to whether you have filled out your survey, please contact City Hall at 785-562-5331 we will be happy to look it up.

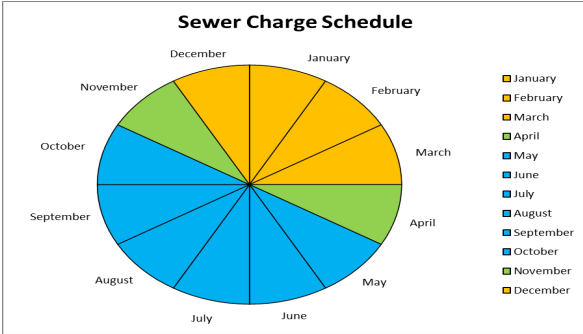
Brush Dump

Our city brush dump is open from 9 am until dark 7 days a week. We do ask that if you are using our dump to please be aware that it is for grass clippings, limbs, tree stumps, etc. We also ask that when you bring these items to the dump that you sort them and place them in the appropriate area for such items. We do not take landscaping items, construction products such as wood, concrete, bricks, etc. or any other household items. If you have any questions please call City Hall, Monday thru Friday at 785-562-5331. Your attention to our request is greatly appreciated and helps us be able to have it open year round without supervision.

DUE DATES FOR WATER/SEWER BILLS

REMINDER

Summer and Fall months are busy and many activities are going on in and around Marysville. We are sending this friendly reminder to area residents of the regulations regarding trees and shrubs.

Marysville City Code reads:

12-706. Duty to trim trees/bushes on or near public ways.

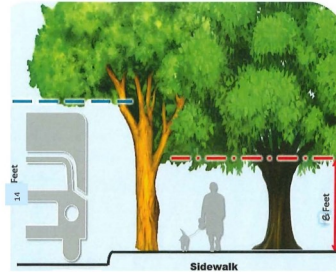
(a) It shall be the duty of the owner or agent of real estate in the city abutting upon a public way to keep all trees and bushes located on or adjacent to such real estate property trimmed in a manner that they will not interfere with public travel upon the public way. Any part of a tree or bush projecting over a street or alley that

- (1) Hangs or protrudes less than fourteen (14) feet above street level;
- (2) Interferes with the visibility of any traffic control device or sign; or
- (3) Obstructs the light from any streetlight is declared to be hazardous and to interfere with the use of the street or alley.

(b) Any part of a tree or of a bush projecting over a sidewalk less than eight (8) feet above sidewalk level is declared to be hazardous and to interfere with the use of the sidewalk.

(c) Any tree or bush located within 35 feet of the curb line of any intersection of the streets in the city is declared to be hazardous unless the lowest branch is trimmed at least fourteen (14) feet and the maximum height of a bush does not exceed 30 inches above the top of the curb nearest the tree or bush unless a member of the Board of Health determines a lower height of the bush is necessary to preclude a traffic or safety hazard.

Address Numbers

Does your home or business have its address number clearly visible from the street? Does your home or business have numbers at all? If you can't see your address number or need to put on numbers, the city has reflective numbers for you to put on your building for **FREE!** Just stop by City Hall and pick them up during business hours.

Having clear and visible numbers on your building is important as it helps emergency vehicles identify where they need to go. In an emergency, every second counts! Having identifiable address helps cut response time.

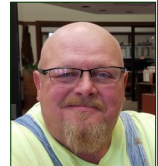

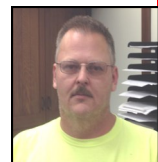

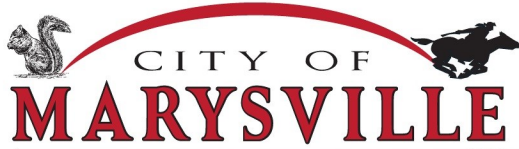

Change/Update Utility Account Holder

In October of 2020, the City passed City Ordinance 1893 that requires citizens to make sure that we have updated information on whose name is on your utility (water) bills. If the person whose name is on the utility bill should die or leaves permanently, the person still residing there shall establish service under their name within 30 days of that event.

In the case of a death, a spouse continuing to live at the residence shall be named as the account holder on the existing account without need for a service connection fee, however an application is required to update our records.

If the premises is inherited, rented, or sold to another party and water is wanted at that address then new paperwork must be completed for the service. We will need an application filled out, current photo ID & \$100 connection fee.

You may come into City Hall to fill out an application at 209 N 8th Street Monday through Friday, 8 am – 5 pm, we can email you a copy of the application, we can put an application in the mail to you or you can visit our website at the following link https://www.cityofmarysvilleks.com/files/ugd/485548_3538a10a2cdd4f74a61a4eecd13099f.pdf.
